It takes roughly two minutes for the cappachino we order to get into our hands. Parents wait 9 months to see the face of their

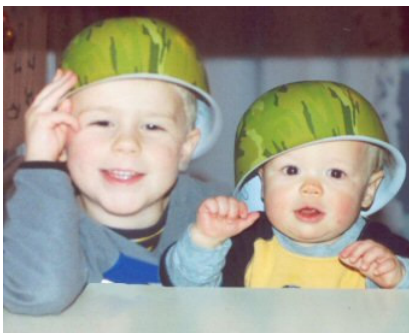


child. Home-owners usually pay for 30 years before they own their home. We, like Isaiah (6:11), have been asking this question,
