## Un FIRST STEPS

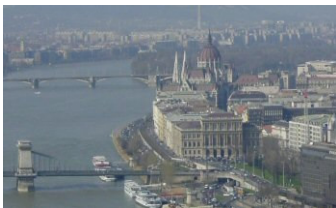
